



We are writing to inform you that (Brevard After School Academy - Central) has been recommended for funding to operate a 21st Century Community Learning Center (21st CCLC) program for the 2019-20 program year. 21st CCLC funding is intended to establish or expand community learning centers that provide free, high-quality programming to students during non-school hours or during periods when school is not in session. 21st CCLC programs in Florida are required to provide students with tutorial services, academic enrichment, personal enrichment, family members' support and a broad array of additional services.

This 21st CCLC program is located at (Cambridge, Golfview, and Saturn Elementary). The target students attending (Cambridge, Golfview and Saturn Elementary) and students enrolled in private, non-profit schools in the geographic area served by the program site(s) are eligible to attend all aspects of the 21st CCLC programming. Similarly, teachers and other educational personnel are welcome to participate in our equitable services, including our professional development opportunities. As required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), we are obligated to provide eligible, non-profit, private schools with timely and meaningful consultation, the ability to present their views, the opportunity to have those views seriously considered and the ability to have a discussion of viable options for ensuring equitable participation of private school students, teachers and other educational personnel.
